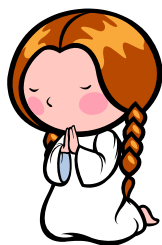
Lakeshore:

On Tuesday, 11/16, from 11-12, the representative from Humana will speak in the Chapel.

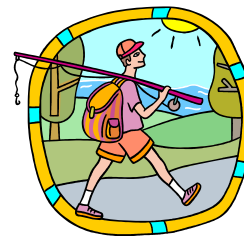
