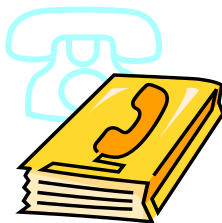
We broke our ticket sales record; we recorded 204 tickets sold...let's go for 250 next year!

Once again, thank you to so many who created such good will and fun at this most important event!

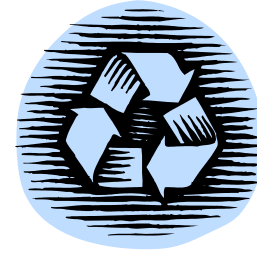
