Rite Aid Pharmacy will also be on hand to provide updated material for the latest news on wellness.

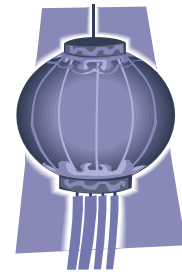
